

Activities and final report



With the local national activities we carried out within the scope of the project; Artistic activities aimed at increasing the self-confidence and motivation of primary school students supported them to express themselves, explore their emotions and think creatively. The activities we carried out at local and national level are:

<< Drama and Theatre Studies:

- -Self-Confidence Theatre: Students were divided into small groups and acted out short stories. Playing the stories they wrote themselves enabled them to express themselves.
- -Emotion Masks: Students were made to make masks expressing different emotions. and small reenactments were made with them.

-Role Reversal Games: They were encouraged to portray different characters to develop their empathy skills.

<< Visual Arts Workshops

- -Self-confidence Board: Students created a board by drawing moments when they felt strong and happy.
- -My Dream Me Drawing: Children were asked to draw themselves as they imagine themselves in the future. Then they were asked to share these dreams in the classroom.
- -Emotion Colours: Each student was asked to write their mood of the day on a piece of paper with colours and shapes. This activity helped them to recognise themselves.

<< Music and Rhythm Studies

- -Self-Confidence Songs: Students created a class song from short lyrics they wrote themselves or with teacher guidance.
- -Making and Playing Instruments: Students made simple instruments with recyclable materials and practised musical expression.
- -Movement and Rhythm Games: Games that develop self-confidence and attention were played with simple rhythm repetitions.

<< Handicrafts and Creative Projects

- -Telling My Own Story: Students were encouraged to write a story from their own lives or imagination and tell it by supporting it with pictures.
- -Friendship Bracelets: Students made bracelets for each other in the classroom and wrote motivational messages.
- -Nature Art: They developed their creativity by making art works with materials such as stones, leaves, etc. collected from nature.

<< Presentation and Storytelling

- -My Story Students were asked to tell an event from their own lives, which improved their speaking skills and self-confidence.
- -Who Has the Microphone? The children took turns taking a handmade microphone and introduced themselves. and shared an interesting memory. In this way, leadership and self-confidence skills were developed.

Such activities enabled children to express themselves better both individually and in groups. While increasing their self-confidence, their motivation was also increased.



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
